

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE
CREATING THE Gosnell VOLUNTEER
FIRE DEPARTMENT AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES".

Ordinance # 10

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF _____
Gosnell, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1: That there is hereby created a city volunteer fire depart-
ment to be officially known as "THE Gosnell VOLUNTEER FIRE
DEPARTMENT".

SECTION 2: That the Gosnell Volunteer Fire Department
shall consist of the Fire Chief, Assistant Fire Chief, Captain, Truck Foreman,
Secretary and Treasurer, and such number of hosemen as the City Council may order,
but not less than SEVEN.

SECTION 3: That the Fire Chief shall be appointed by the City Council
and shall receive a salary of \$ 15 per month, ^{PLUS \$ 2.00 PER FIRE} and he shall be directly charged
with the responsibility and accountability to the city for all equipment and have
control and management of the organization. He shall name and select, with the
approval of the City Council, the members of the department, and shall direct and
control all the work of the department.

SECTION 4: That there shall be held not less than one meeting each
month of the department for the purpose of instructing and training, and that all
members shall attend unless excused for reasonable cause, the regular meeting to
be held the fourth Monday night in each month; that the Gosnell
Volunteer Fire Department shall adopt such rules as may be deemed necessary for
the proper functioning of the department, but that all such rules shall be sub-
ject to the approval of the City Council.

SECTION 5: That all members of the Gosnell Volunteer
Fire Department, who have been selected and approved as herein provided, shall re-
ceive the sum of \$ 2.00 for attendance upon and for service at each and every
fire, service at each and every fire being deemed to have been performed when the

circumstances of such fire are such as to require the necessity of unloading and connecting the hose to the fire hydrant.

SECTION 6: That the Fire Chief shall keep a record of the names of the members who attend the monthly meeting and who perform service at each fire, and that he shall submit a full statement of the number of fires attended by each member each month to the Town Council at its next regular meeting.

SECTION 7: That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, and this ordinance being necessary for the protection and preservation of the public welfare shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval, and publication.
