

ORDINANCE NO. 19

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PLUMBING CODE AS
ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH OF ARKANSAS

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Gosnell, Arkansas:

Section 1. The Arkansas State Plumbing Code adopted by the State Board of Health of Arkansas, Fifth Edition, 1971, and designated as the Arkansas State Plumbing Code governing the construction, installation and inspection of plumbing and drainage is hereby adopted in full as an Ordinance of the City of Gosnell.

Section 2. From and after passage and approval of this Ordinance all plumbing, construction and installations which may be installed in the City of Gosnell, Arkansas, shall be in the manner and form prescribed in the aforementioned Arkansas State Plumbing Code.

Section 3. All individuals, firms or corporations installing, constructing or in any manner placing in use plumbing and/or drainage shall comply with the Arkansas State Plumbing Code mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 4. Any person, firm, corporation, or association of persons engaged in the business of plumbing and/or drainage violating any of the provisions of said Code shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed \$25.00 and any such construction shall be immediately stopped and shall not continue until conformity with the provisions of said Code shall have been met.

Section 5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 6. The City of Gosnell is in need of establishing its own sewer system with the help of its citizens and in order to establish same, it is necessary that compliance with the Arkansas State Plumbing Code be required. An emergency is therefore declared and this ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

SECTION 3: Violators of any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined in an amount not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) and not more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each separate offense.

SECTION 4: The Council has determined that action should be taken immediately to prohibit the use of the weapons described in this Ordinance and to prohibit the discharge of fire arms within the corporate limits as same constitute a hazard to the occupants of the town. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety, shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
